AIMS:


Remembering and cherishing the day when India became a sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic.

- right to speak freely and putting own views, everything depends on Constitution of India.






OBJECTIVES:

- **Cultural Exchange:** The fest facilitates cultural exchange and dialogue among students from different backgrounds, promoting cross-cultural understanding and tolerance.




Objectives:


- To raise awareness about the importance of Khadi and its contribution to India's freedom movement.



- To understand leadership independent of what we know about management – on the assumption that leadership occurs in relation to followers, not as an exercise of authority.
- To focus on what we can learn from followers about leadership.
- To remove the mystique from leadership and relate it to what a wide variety of people are capable of doing.
- To describe leadership by beginning at the level of observation and to ask “what do leaders do when they lead?”
- To capitalise on well done observational studies already completed.
- To apply a method of analysis that has not been used, or used infrequently, to analyse the concept.

Circular was sent to all the students a day prior regarding the anti- ragging awareness event.


As per the circular shared students were asked to assemble in basketball court at 1:30pm.
